Head Start Disability Services Newsletter

Each issue of this monthly listserv is focused on a topic (e.g., June 2023 focused on involving fathers of children with disabilities). Each issue also includes examples of evidence-based practices, things to read, videos to watch, and ideas for applying the content in the issue. The June issue, for example, featured a guide on Creating Father-Friendly Environments in Early Childhood Programs. Most resources are available in English and Spanish. These are great supports for faculty and PD providers as they compile materials for promoting both knowledge acquisition and knowledge application. This one-way listserv appears electronically every other month and provides information that may be of interest to early childhood faculty and professional development providers. Each issue includes *content* resources (e.g., videos, resources, and readings) and *pedagogical* resources (e.g., assignments and instructional strategies), all of which are free and readily available.
