

REFERRAL PROCESS FOR NORTH CAROLINA

If you suspect a child has a developmental delay or disability you can refer to early intervention or special education for evaluation and, if found eligible, services and supports.

All children ages 0-21 are entitled to free evaluation for developmental delay or disability under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

Use the chart to the right to determine how to refer a child for evaluation based on the child's age.

NOTE: Once a referral is made, the evaluation must occur within 45 days.

Early intervention is a system of services that helps babies and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities. No family is ever denied service because of their inability to pay.

SPECIAL EDUCATION PROCESS

Special education is instruction specifically designed to meet the educational and developmental needs of children with disabilities, or those who are experiencing developmental delays. Services for preschool children (ages 3 through 5) are provided free of charge through the public school system.
